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ABOUT MALDIVES

The Maldives is located southeast of India, just above the equator. The various atolls that make up the Maldives are the peaks of submerged volcanoes, sculpted by ocean currents and covered over thousands of years by coral. In this region, there are two seasons:

Northeast current from November to April (our winter)
Southwest current from May to October (our summer)
Diving can be practiced throughout the year.

During the northeast current, the waters are clearer on the eastern side of the atoll, while during the southwest current, they are clearer on the western side. The active currents bring significant movement from pelagic predators, with a wide variety of sharks and rays, especially in the channels.

The nutrient-rich waters create a perfect environment for large plankton feeders, such as manta rays and whale sharks.

DEEP SOUTH ROUTE

The Deep South of the Maldives always leaves you wanting more.

In 7 nights of cruising, you'll get to enjoy encounters with large pelagics while exploring the last 3 atolls of the Maldives. The beauty of the reefs, manta rays at cleaning stations, and the channels of the southern atolls offer spectacular pelagic life and countless grey reef sharks.

Atolls visited: Gaaf Alif, Addu, and Fuvahmulah.

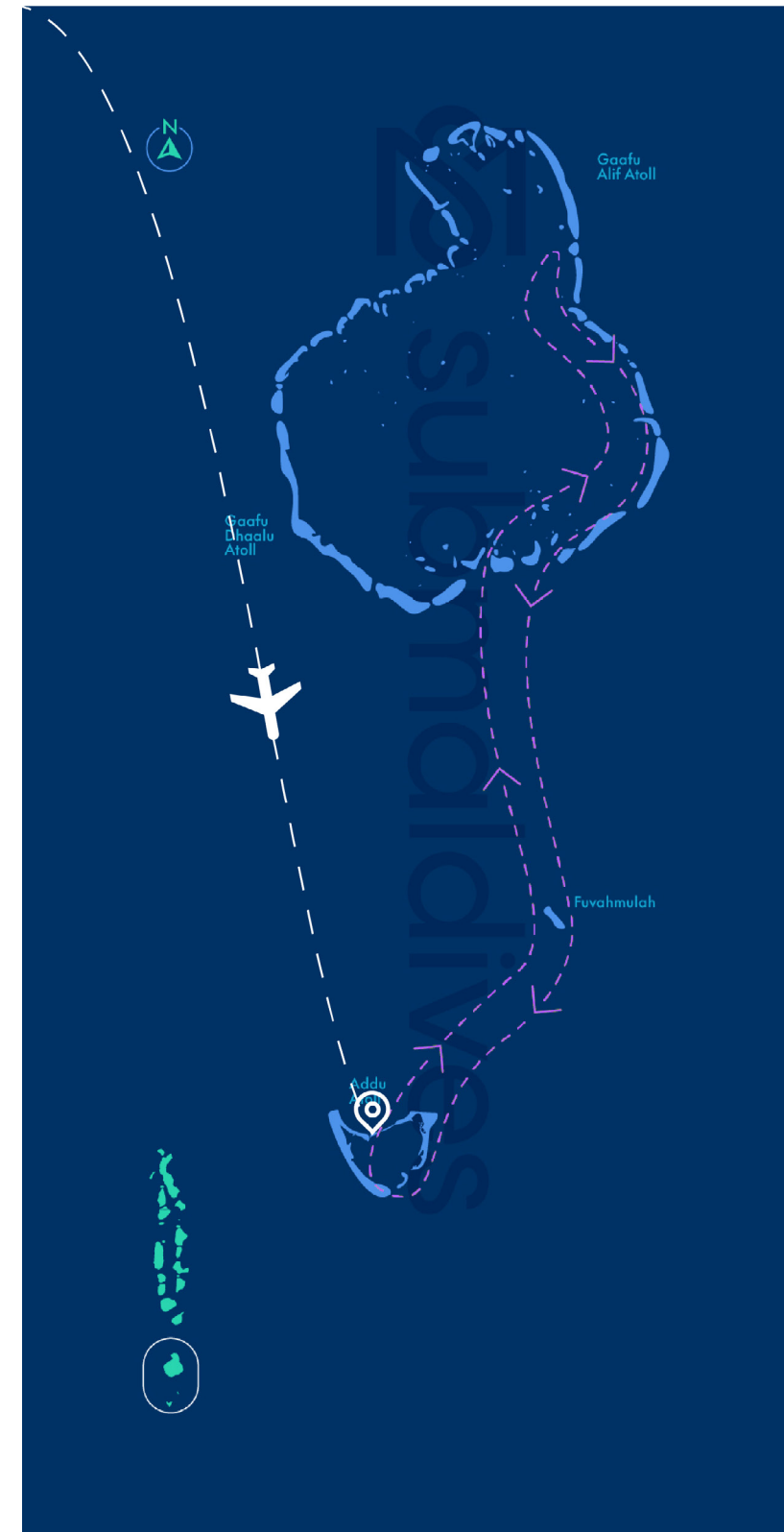
You'll see numerous shark species: hammerhead, bull, schools of silvertips, oceanic black-tips, leopard, and thresher sharks. During the cruise, we'll enjoy 2-3 dives with tiger sharks at Fuvahmulah Atoll, as well as a night dive with whale sharks at Gaaf Alif Atoll.

From Gan to Gan

Departing from Addu (Gan Airport), this route sails north, visiting the incredible Fuvahmulah Atoll, where tiger sharks take center stage, and continues on to Gaaf Alif Atoll. At the end of the journey, we return once again to Gan Airport for disembarkation.



How to get to the boarding point in Gan?

To join this Southern Route Maldives cruise, the embarkation and disembarkation point is Gan Airport, located in Addu Atoll in the southern part of the country. There are two main options to reach Gan:

Option 1 – International flight via Colombo (Sri Lanka):

Fly from your home city to Colombo (CMB), Sri Lanka. From there, take a direct flight to Gan (GAN) with Sri-Lankan Airlines.

Option 2 – Via Malé (capital of Maldives):

Fly from your home city to Male (MLE), the main international airport of the Maldives. From Male, take two domestic flights: Male – Gan and Gan – Male.

GAAF ALIF

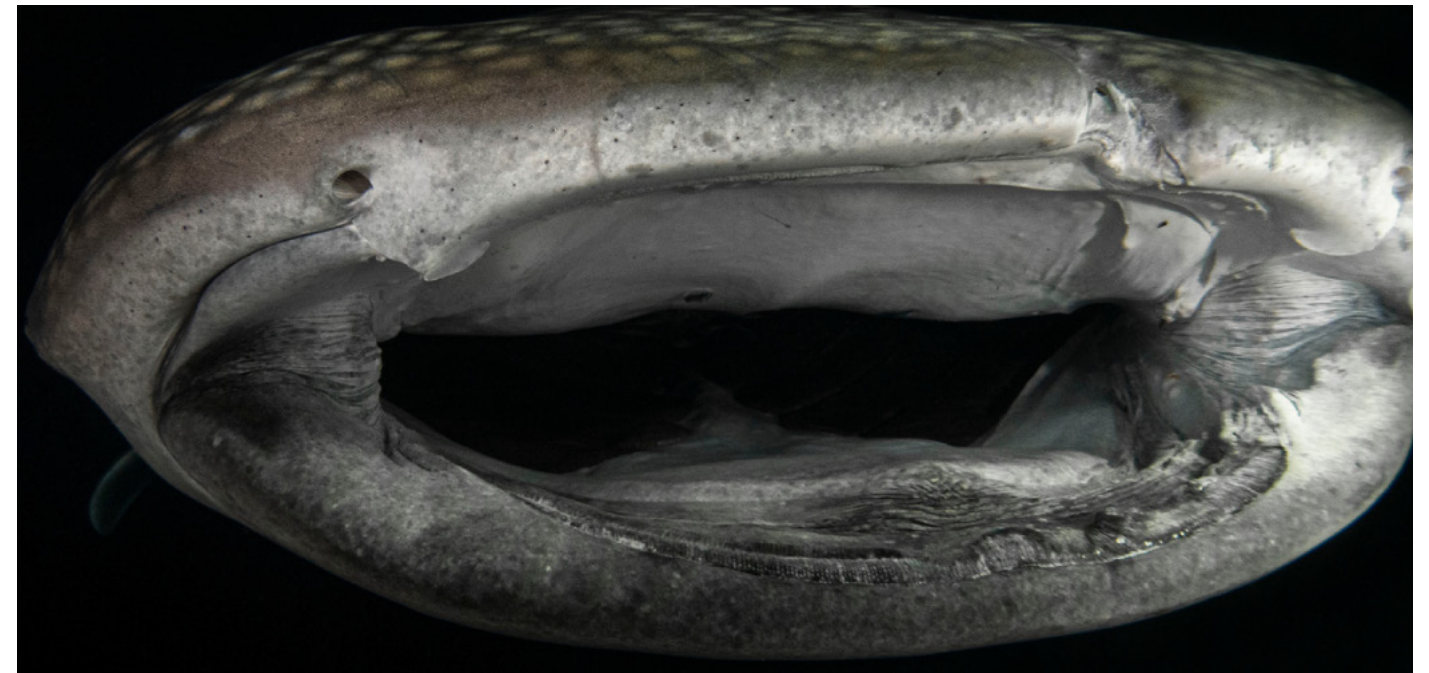
Sharks in the channels. Possibly the best channel in the Maldives, near the island of Viligili. Dozens or even hundreds of sharks will pass before our eyes—an unforgettable moment. Reefs full of coral with green turtles and the chance to see the leopard shark. A dive with blacktip (spinner) sharks, grey reef sharks, bull sharks, guitarfish, and once again, a spot in the center of the atoll with whale sharks at night.

FUVAHMULAH

In the second-to-last atoll of the Maldives lies this island in the middle of the ocean, where anything can happen. For lovers of big marine life—especially oceanic sharks—the undeniable star is the tiger shark. You may also spot hammerhead sharks, giant hammerheads, silvertip sharks, thresher sharks, and oceanic manta rays.

ADDU

This atoll, the southernmost in the Maldives, takes the country beyond the equator and into the Southern Hemisphere. On this route, we cross the equator both on the way out and on the return. The highlight dive is a manta ray cleaning station, where these magnificent animals come to rid themselves of parasites, as well as a World War II wreck. Expect large sharks and giant turtles, along with rich outer reefs full of marine life. The manta ray cleaning station stands out as the main attraction, offering a chance to witness these graceful creatures up close.

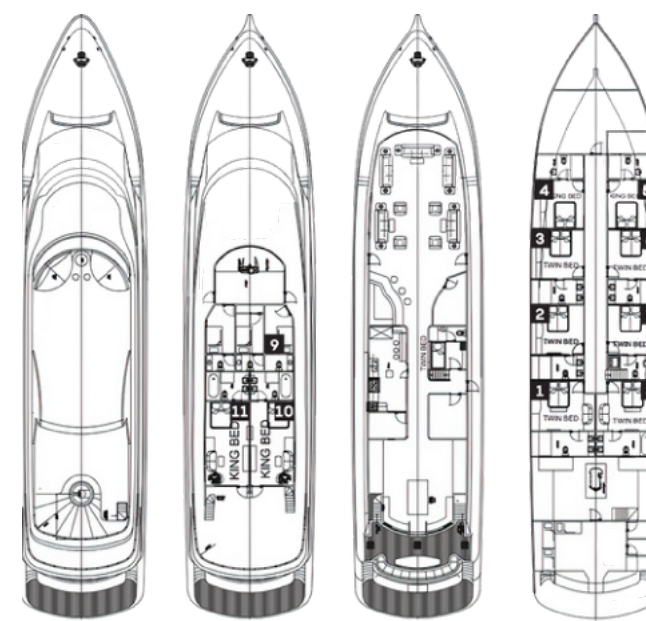

The majestic SeaRose II, a 45-meter liveboard, offers diving and snorkeling cruises year-round in the crystal-clear waters of the Maldives. Diving is conducted from a fully equipped, dedicated 17-meter dive dhoni (boat).

On the upper deck, the SeaRose II features 11 well-appointed cabins, each with its own air conditioning and private bathroom, accommodating up to 20 guests. On board, there's plenty of space to relax—whether in the dining area with a well-stocked bar, or in the spacious lounge with a flat-screen TV and entertainment system. Guests can also unwind outdoors on the sun deck, complete with a jacuzzi, and take in the stunning views of the Maldives.
